

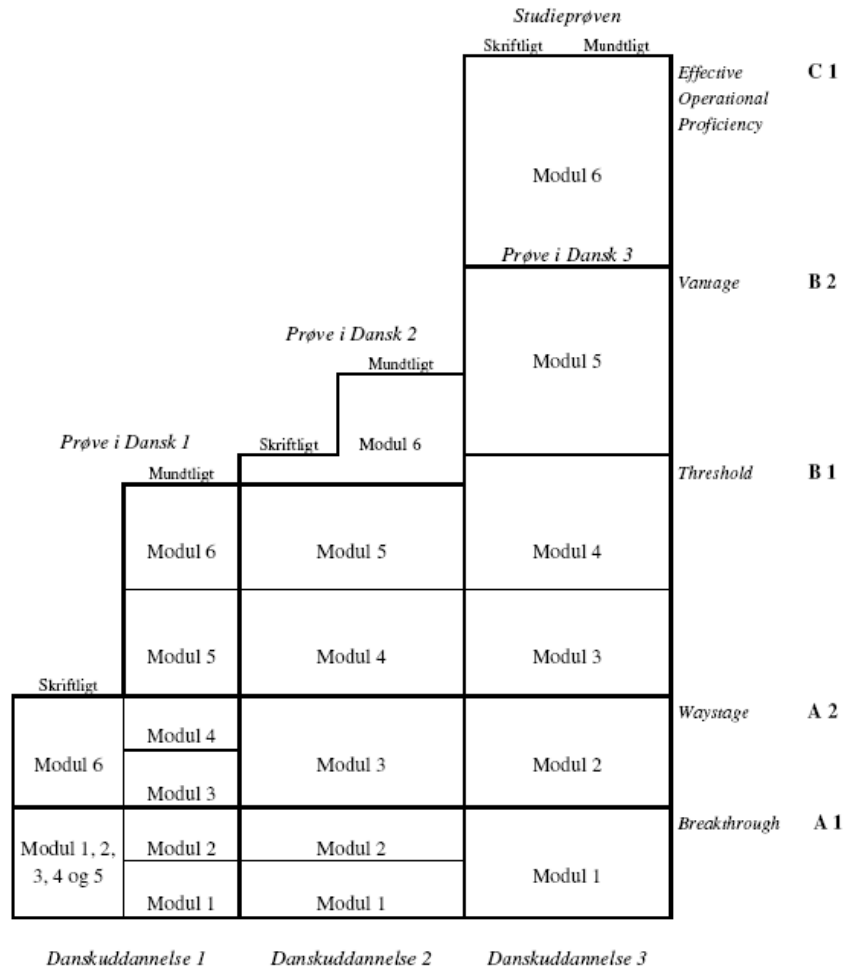

The Danish Language Testing Consortium was formed early in 1993 and brings together three organisations: Studeskolerne in Denmark, The Danish University of Education and the Ministry of Refugee, Immigration and Integration Affairs.

Studieskolerne is a chain of language centres that provide the administration of the Danish language tests together with other language centres in the country.

Danish 3 Examination

- Reading comprehension
 - Focus on ability to read quickly and find specific information in a text.
 - Focus on the ability to inspect a text and understand the attitudes, intentions and important details in the text.

Danish 3, Writing

- Write an informal/formal letter
- Write a longer, coherent production on a given topic, supplemented with illustrations and factual materials. 200 – 300 words

Danish 3, Oral kommunikation

- Consists of 4 parts:
- 1) a monologue, prepared 5 days before oral exam starts, and related to the themes: DK before and now, work, education and citizenship and everydaylife
- A short interview
- A conversation between the 2 trial participants/ students.
- A diskussion initiated by questions asked by the examiner.

Evaluation 1

- newly arrived foreigners under the new act on Danish Education learned Danish markedly faster than under the formerly language program.
- the Act on Danish Education of 2004 contributes to both the students employment or education and provides the basis for active citizenship in Denmark.
- students are very satisfied with the educational provision they receive

- Limited success toward more vocationally oriented teaching and courses.
- Focus on testing -> students do not achieve the depth of linguistic ability, such as required in the education system

Evaluation 2

The course participants exhibit faster progression if:

- They have not just arrived in Denmark (significant for women on Danish Education 1 and 3)
- They are under the age of 30 (the older the slower)
- They received extensive education in their home country
- They have a low rate of non-attendance
- They come from a Western nation.

Suggestions for adjustment

- Free Online Danish lessons.
- 'Intro Danish' for working immigrants.
- Vouchers system to be used within 5 years.
- Vouchers for 1-2 modules for Au Pairs.
- Module payments in two rates..
- Individual learning plans not mandatory for students with normal progression.

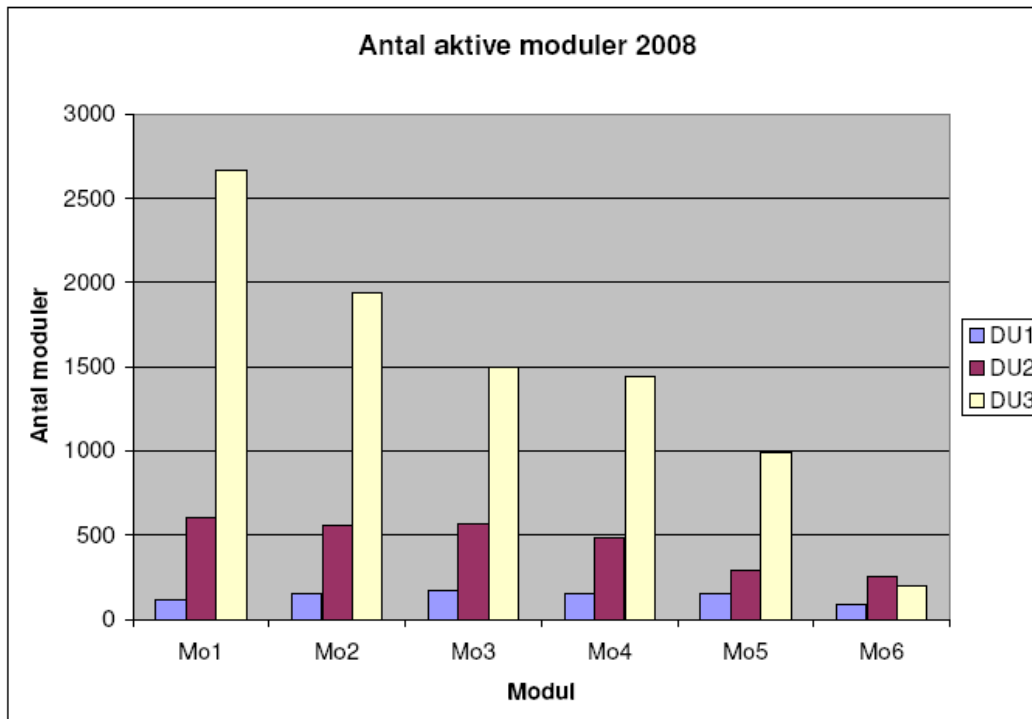

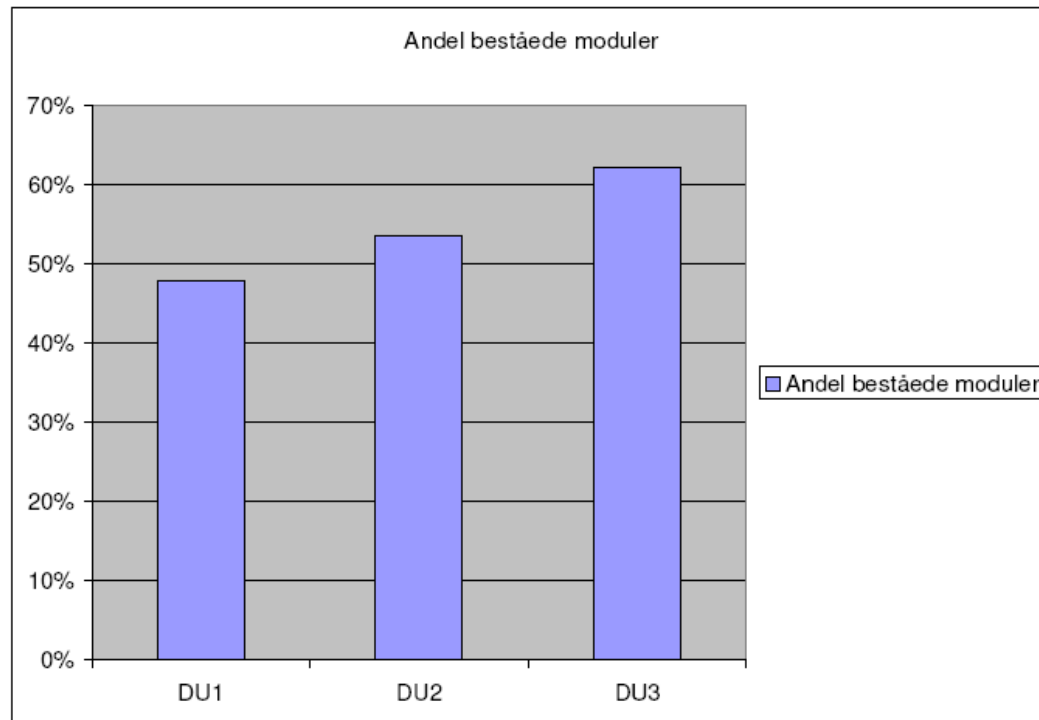

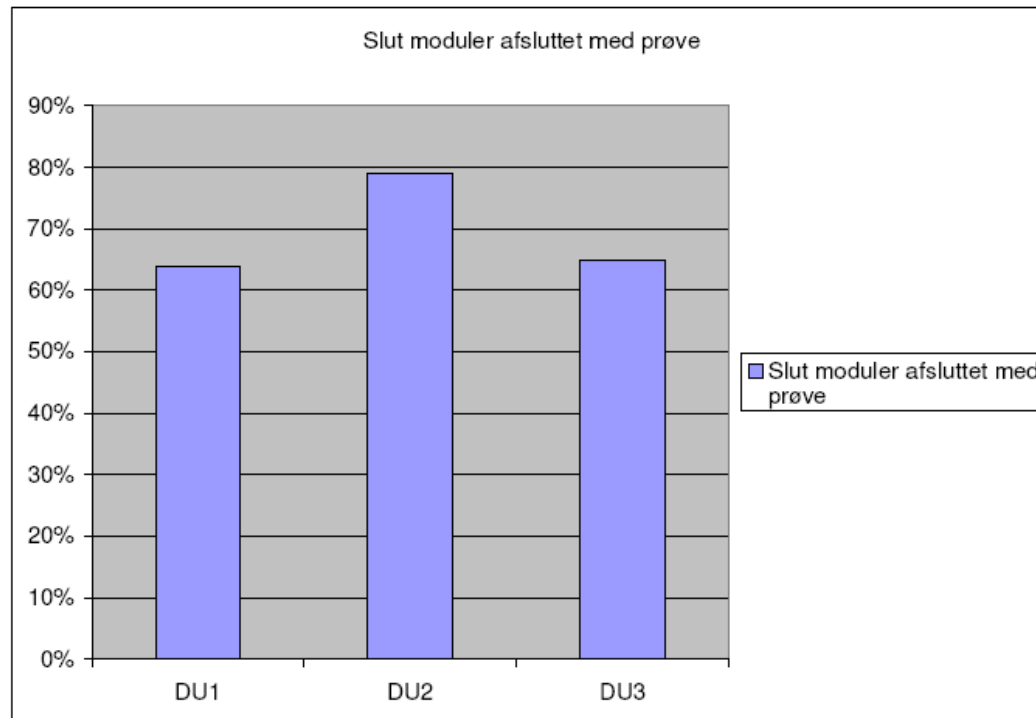
